Study Purpose

to provide evidence on the determinants of workers' thriving, with $\underline{long\text{-}term\ goals}$ of informing and evaluating $\underline{Total\ Worker}$ $\underline{Health}^{\mathscr{B}}$ interventions and workplace and public policies focused on improving worker well-being.

Thriving from Work is an integrated indicator of worker well-being



... is the state of positive mental, physical, and social functioning in which workers' experiences of their work and working conditions enable them to thrive in their overall lives, contributing to their ability to achieve their full potential in their work, home, and community.

Identify priority areas for interventions to improve well-being

Identify working conditions and worker factors associated with workers' thriving across sectors.

2

Determine the extent to which working conditions influence changes in workers' thriving over time in a longitudinal study in construction. 3

Determine the extent to which organizational integrated health and safety PPPs are associated with workers' thriving. 4
